

1 Historical Context: Two Paradigms Clashing

Global crisis of old paradigm

- » Financial crisis
- » Environmental crisis
- » Energetic crisis
- » Social crisis

Context of clash

- » Wikileaks & reactions
- » Arab revolutions & spin-offs in the West
- » Internet control (ACTA, eG8, NATO)

Communities challenges

- » Difficult to form a **new node**/organization
- » Nodes work **isolated**, and are poorly connected (disperse network)
- » Difficult **communication** flow between nodes
- » **Collaboration** among them is rare

How to promote the creation, in each field, of community-driven alternatives to the Closed Paradigm?

How to build tools that facilitate collaboration among communities?

3 Today's practices

Current Problem: Communities need tools for communication & collaboration

Why not using FLOSS collaborative tools?

- » **Usability problem:** mainly for Geek
- » Dependency on them to build/maintain tools/websites
- » Solution needed: **New usable tools**

Similar example: photography in the past

- » **Usability problem:** was only for professional
- » Bottle-neck: Dependency on professionals to develop photo-films
- » Solution: **New usable tools:** Digital Camera
 - Allowed users to be autonomous and thus boosted photography

Existing solutions:

- Commercial (Google Docs, Facebook, Youtube...):
- » **Usable** proprietary commercial services
- » But: Centralized, Antiprivacy, Ads, Censorship... Alternatives (Diaspora, identi.ca, OpenOffice...)
- » Tend to roughly imitate commercial tools
 - instead of *building a new model that makes the existing model obsolete!*
- » **Focused on sharing, not on building**
- on Communication not on *Collaboration*
- on interaction for fun, not for *activism*



Our desired solution:

- » **Collaborative** tools for Free Culture & Commons
- » **Usable** decentralized non-commercial free tools
- » **New Model** that makes existing tools obsolete

2 In the new paradigm

Free/Libre/Open Source Software (FLOSS)

- » **Successful example** of collaboration within communities
- » Networks building useful stuff

Tools which were needed for the success of FLOSS

- » Philosophical Tools: manifestos, definitions, R. Stallman
- » Legal Tools: copyleft, licenses (e.g. GPL)
- » Technical Tools: tools that facilitate & promote collaboration among developers (e.g. Mailman, CVS, Wikis)

Tools needed for the success of Free Culture?

- » *Philosophical Tools:* FreedomDefined, L. Lessig, etc
- » *Legal Tools:* Creative Commons
- » *Technical Tools:* **Needed!**

Tools needed for the success of the Commons?

- » *Philosophical Tools:* P2PFoundation, D. Bollier, E. Ostrom, etc
- » *Legal Tools:* **Needed!!** (anti-patent, environmental regulations, etc)
- » *Technical Tools:* **Needed!!**

In the new paradigm:

Legal and Technical tools are needed to move from philosophies to practice...

A web-tool & infrastructure:

- » Focused on the **collaborative work** of social initiatives/academic groups/etc
- » Communication: **Social Networking**
- » **Multimedia** galleries & gadgets
- » Easily building of **web-pages**
- » Many tools in one
- » Encouraging **CreativeCommons** contents
- » **Usable, Decentralized & Free/Open Source**
- » Fruit of our experience with ourproject.org (2002-2011)

6 Technical Details

Decentralized

- » Many servers with different deployments of Kune that interoperate transparently with each other
- Users of different servers can work together
- » Institutions/Universities/Social Forums can provide their groups with customized Kunes

Customizable

- » Developing new gadgets is very easy [similar to Firefox extensions]
- » Adapted Kunes for specific needs, with specific gadgets or tools

Technologies

- » GWT: Java to complex AJAX
- Single-page rich web applications
- » Open protocols: XMPP/Jabber, Wave Protocol
- » Everything free (Affero GPL)

Communication

Social Network [similar to Facebook]

- » Privacy: each content can be shared with certain people/groups or be public

Chat

- » Compatible with Gmail-chat / Jabber
- » Group-chat, chatrooms

Collaboration for Groups

Simultaneous edition [similar to Google Docs]

- » ...of documents, webs, galleries, or anything
- Group contents CreativeCommons by default
- » Boosts sharing&adaptation of contents

Group-work

- » Online meetings (with collaboratively edited minutes), Polls, ...
- » Building together private/restricted/public documents, webs, etc

Group discovery*

- » Follow & Connect with other groups
- » Recommendation of other groups

Set of Available Tools

Creation of: documents, blogs, wikis (usable!), task list, mailing lists, barbers [similar to a decentralized Ebay], ...

Everything **easily publishable** on the Web*

- » Usable Web building

All tools are available in:

- » Personal space (personal blog, curriculum, etc)
- » Group space (a space for each group, with their docs, chats, etc)

Multimedia & Gadgets

Galleries of photos & videos*

Gadgets: Maps, Polls, MindMaps, Spelling, Twitter streams, Bots & third-parties extensions...
